Here is some info regarding Pecks and Russons land. I’m not sure when Russons first bought their land.

Elisha Peck Sr. came from England as a “Mormon” convert around 1868. His wife to be Charlotte Russon also a convert arrived from England the fall of 1869. They were married Nov. 7, 1870 and settled in Lehi. Their first son Elisha Peck Jr. was born Nov 19, 1871. He was married to Elizabeth Jane Wilson March 20, 1895. they bought this dry sandy bench property about 1899 and moved their family into a small log cabin on the farm. The lott Russon family purchased the ground West of Pecks and made it into a productive farm. Four generations of Pecks have farmed the land and descendants of both families’ still own parcels next to each other. A LDS Chapel site was picked by local leaders on the Peck property. Stake President Douglas Muir with Lamont Peterson & Ron L. Peck as counselors dedicated the beautiful Chapel to the Lord May 27, 2007
